Presentation: May 21 - Lee Ahenakiw, CEO of Nutraponics

Lee Ahenakiw presented us his organisation, Nutraponics, a company that is developing an innovative method of producing vegetables using a closed loop aquaponic system. This involves uncommon energy sources, fish to produce nutritious "poop" as fertilizer and stacks of large trays to grow the produce. The company hopes to be able to grow vegetables close to presently underserved markets such as the far north.

The company has a demonstration facility in Ardrossan (40 Km east of Edmonton), which opened in 2015 (and which we hope to visit in the fall). They also expect to move to a commercially sustainable production facility in 2020.

Tour: May 28 and May 30 - Christopher Martin of CBC Edmonton


